

Council of National Cultural Institutions Conservation Training Bursary Terms and Conditions

1. Students must be either born on the island of Ireland and/or long-term residents of the island of Ireland. Proof of status must be submitted with application, e.g. education history/job references.

2. Bursaries will only be awarded to students wishing to undertake a recognised conservation training course, which must lead to a professional qualification. The maximum award will be €2,500 which will be paid directly to the college/university.
3. The application form, a cover letter requesting funding, together with a full C.V. should be submitted by the advertised deadline.
4. Where relevant, references for voluntary/student work should be given.
5. A letter, confirming the offer of a place from the relevant institution should accompany the application. In the case of 2nd year students, this should be accompanied by a letter from the course tutor confirming successful completion of the previous year.
6. The Board will consider all applications. Where necessary further information may be requested from a candidate.
7. In the case of multiple applications, monies will be awarded to qualifying candidates depending on sectoral need. Preference will be given to the discipline specified in the advertisement.
8. Candidates will be informed of the outcome of their application as soon as possible, no later than July 31st, 2012.
9. Receipt of a bursary in any given year does not automatically guarantee funding for subsequent years. Students must reapply annually for any bursary that may be available.
10. The amount of money awarded to each student is dependent on the funds available.
11. The availability of bursaries will be advertised through CNCI affiliated institutions, the IPCRA e- newsletter and website and through the Heritage Council.

Applications must be submitted by 12 noon on Monday 2nd July 2012.
